GENERAL

1. The course will be determined on the day but will start and finish close to the beach at Limekilns Pier.
2. The race start time will be 14:00 on Sunday 28th June 2026.
3. There will be a safety boat in attendance.
4. This is a fun event; therefore, all crews are expected to participate in the appropriate spirit.

PRIZES

1. The race winner will be awarded the prestigious Limekilns Raft Race Trophy, kindly donated by the Bruce Arms.
2. Prizes will also be awarded for the Most Unique Raft Design (inc. Fancy Dress) and the “Best Endeavour Raft”.

RAFTERS

1. All competitors must be aged 16 or over and understand participation is at their own risk.
2. All competitors must wear a life jacket or floatation device and be able to swim.
3. Each raft is allowed a maximum of 6 crew.
4. All crews are responsible for the removal of their own raft and any debris from the water and beach immediately after completion of the race.
5. Appropriate footwear should be worn - no wellies or boots.
6. Competitors under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be immediately disqualified.

RAFTS

1. The winning raft must finish the course with the same compliment of crew that it started with.
2. Sabotage or interference with other rafts is not permitted and will result in disqualification, albeit the use of water pistols and biodegradable water bombs is allowed. No hard or unpleasant materials are to be used.
3. All rafts must be propelled manually. Also, for safety reasons, all crew must be positioned “on” and not enclosed within the raft.
4. All rafts must be constructed of readily available materials, and must not, in the opinion of the organisers resemble too closely, boats or canoes. The principal buoyancy of the raft is to be provided by barrels, drums or other buoyant components but not formed from existing watercraft (eg paddleboards) lashed together.
5. All materials used to construct the raft must be free from any toxic materials or potential contaminates.

All persons taking part in the event, in whatever capacity, do so at their own risk, knowing that there is always an element of danger in such events. Furthermore, they acknowledge that there is no responsibility whatsoever upon those organising the event. Skippers are personally responsible for bringing this disclaimer to the attention of all members of their crew.
